Leander is now only a couple of weeks away from celebrating 100 years, and we are holding a reunion event 'Picture the Past' on Saturday 4th April. I am hoping many of you will be able to attend or pop in for a short time to salute the Group's wonderful achievement.

Since the last issue of the Water Rat in December, Leander as a whole has been very busy, attending many District and County Activities (see section report for more details).




Coxswain's Corner
